

Tips with reference to the comments of the existing cohorts of APL students at SPC

DON'T

- take it as an interest class with no commitment
- replace it as an elective subject in DSE
- enrol a course without consulting the CLP Master, teachers and parents

DO

- study the information in the official webpages/ join the virtual exhibition
- evaluate the time management for balancing academic studies and the social skills for group work with students from other schools
- join the taster programmes to gain some authentic experience before making decision





2. Subject Allocation Procedure: How does it work?

- Students have to indicate their preferences of Curriculum between DSE and IAL as well as rank the Elective Subjects and Mathematics Extended Modules according to their preferences
- A computer software programme is used to generate an academic structure that can highly accommodate students' preferences
- Allocation of Elective Subjects according to students' <u>final order of</u> merit in F.3
- Allocation of Mathematics (Core only / Core + M1 / Core + M2) according to students' <u>Mathematics examination results</u>



Satisfaction Rates in the Past Three Years



Academic Year	Satisfaction Rate for First Three Choices
2019-2020 F.4 (HKDSE only)	86.2%
2020-2021 F.4 (HKDSE only)	89.0%
2021-2022 F.4 (HKDSE only)	90.23%



3. CAN I DROP/CHANGE AN ELECTIVE OR M1/M2?

- Form 4: There is no provision for students to drop an elective and enrol in another elective. However, students can join the waiting list for the more preferred elective in early September. (*Please refer to Page 30 of the Handbook*.)
- Form 5: Subject to the Principal's approval, students can drop an elective subject if they cannot cope with the workload. **Application should be** made before the F.4 summer vacation starts.

Application submitted before	To be Effective from (depending on the Final Exam results of the subject to-be*)
Start of Term 1 in F.4	1st Week of Term 1 in F.4
(by Mid-August)	(case by case, subject to the availability)
1st Month of Term 1 in F.4	beginning of F.5
(by the end of September)	(+ Mid-year Exam as a trial*)
5 school days after the	beginning of F.5
F.4 parents' day	(Final Exam only*)
