

Let us prav:

O Lord our God in this Holy Week we give you thanks and praise, for this is the time you have made your own. the days that fill us with both fear and great joy. During this Holy Week our Lord Jesus Christ gathered in the upper room with his disciples to celebrate the Last Supper. He was mocked and beaten and nailed to the wood of the Cross for our sins. He died for us and was laid in a cold tomb. But you sent your angels to roll back the stone and you raised Jesus from the dead. Never again need we search for Jesus in the places of dead memories and buried dreams, for now he has been raised and goes forever ahead of us to open the gates of heaven. preaching peace and the forgiveness of sins. Indeed though he was the stone rejected by the builders, you have made him the cornerstone. the rock on which is founded the life everlasting. the life that is hidden for us in Christ until it is revealed with Christ in glory. We thank you and we praise you O God, both now, and through your living word. eternally. Amen.

First Reading Luke 23:13-25

Jesus Sentenced to Death

STAND

Pilate then called together the chief priests, the leaders, Narrator: and the people, and said to them,

'You brought me this man as one who was perverting the Pilate: people; and here I have examined him in your presence and have not found this man guilty of any of your charges against him. Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us. Indeed, he has done nothing to deserve death. I will therefore have him flogged and release him.'

Then they all shouted out together, Narrator:

ALL: 'Away with this man! Release Barabbas for us!'

Narrator: (Barabbas was a man who had been put in prison for an insurrection that had taken place in the city, and for murder.) Pilate, wanting to release Jesus, addressed them again; but they kept shouting,

ALL: 'Crucify, crucify him!'

Narrator: A third time he said to them,

Pilate: 'Why, what evil has he done? I have found in him no ground for the sentence of death; I will therefore have him flogged and then release him.'

But they kept urgently demanding with loud shouts that Narrator: he should be crucified; and their voices prevailed. So Pilate gave his verdict that their demand should be granted. He released the man they asked for, the one who had been put in prison for insurrection and murder, and he handed Jesus over as they wished.

Second Reading Luke 23:25-49

The Crucifixion & Death of Jesus

STAND

Narrator: As they led him away, they seized a man, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming from the country, and they laid the cross on him, and made him carry it behind Jesus. A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. But Jesus turned to them and said,

'Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children.'

Narrator: Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said,

Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.'

Narrator: And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying,

ALL: <u>'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!'</u>

Narrator: The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying,

ALL: 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!'

Narrator: There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying,

1st Thief: 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!'

Narrator: But the other rebuked him, saying,

2nd Thief: 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.'

Narrator: Then he said,

2nd Thief: 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.'

Narrator: Jesus replied,


¥ 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'

Narrator: It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said,

Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.'

Centurion: 'Certainly this man was innocent.'

Narrator: And when all the crowds who had gathered there for this spectacle saw what had taken place, they returned home, beating their breasts. But all his acquaintances, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.

Third Reading Luke 24:1-12, 36-41 The Resurrection of Jesus

Narrator: On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them,

Angels: 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.'

Narrator: Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest.

The two followers of Jesus who met the risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus went back to Jerusalem, where they found the eleven disciples gathered together with the others and told them what happened.

Two followers: The Lord is risen indeed! He has appeared to Simon!

Narrator: The two men then explained to them what had happened on the road, and how they had recognised the Lord when he broke the

bread. While the two were telling them this, suddenly the Lord himself stood among them and spoke to them.

Peace be with you.

Narrator: They were terrified, thinking that they were seeing a ghost. But he spoke to them.

Why are you alarmed? Why are these doubts coming up in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet, and see that it is I myself. Touch me, and you will know, for a ghost doesn't have flesh and bones, as you can see I have.

Narrator: Then Jesus also showed them his hands and his feet. They still could not believe, they were so full of joy and wonder.

Throughout the world Christians celebrate the mighty power of God as Christ calls us out of darkness to share in his marvellous light.
