N.B. In the event of public announcements by the Education Bureau that all schools are to be closed on any day during the Internal Examination period, the examination(s) scheduled on that day will be postponed until further notice.

1. Seating Arrangements  
Find your class number in the Seating Plan placed at the entrance of the examination centre – then enter and take the seat bearing your class number.
2. Examination Stationery - All paper will be provided, including scrap paper. Students are NOT allowed to bring any paper into the examination centre.
3. Students must be dressed in PROPER SCHOOL UNIFORM when in the school premises during school hours, including examination time. Students must not wear long hair or have a weird hairstyle. Students who fail to observe these rules will be subject to disciplinary action.
4. Late Arrivals –
  - (a) A student who arrives late but within 30 minutes of the start of the paper may be admitted but **no extra time will be given**.
  - (b) A student who arrives more than 30 minutes late may be permitted to take the examination but the script may not be accepted by the examiner.
5. Early Leavers
  - (a) Multiple Choice Papers – No student will be allowed to leave before the end of the examination.  
  
Conventional Papers – Students are NOT allowed to leave the exam. centre within the first half hour or the last fifteen minutes. A student who wants to leave early must raise his hand and leave only after his scripts have been checked by an invigilator.  
  
Mixed (Multiple Choice + Conventional) Papers – No early leavers.
6. Student must check carefully to make sure that there are no missing pages in the question paper. They should inform the teacher if they have questions or there are missing pages in the question paper.
7. At the end of the examination period, students must tie all answer sheets in their correct order with the strings provided.
8. If students are having several examinations in the morning, they will not be allowed to leave the school during the break or breaks in between them. If they do so, they will not be permitted to re-enter the school to take the next examination in the morning.
9. Personal belongings may be left inside the exam. centre at students' own risk. The school cannot be responsible. For Hall and G.P. Room centres, they may be left inside at a place to be indicated by the Chief Invigilator.
10. All mobile phones must be switched off during an examination. Students may risk a mark penalty if they fail to do so.

11. The serious consequences of cheating in an examination

Students should study hard and not cheat in any examinations as cheating in an examination is a very serious breach of discipline.

The following measures will be taken:

- (a) A student caught cheating in an examination of a paper of any subject will be given '0' marks for the entire subject;
- (b) In addition, further disciplinary action will be taken;
- (c) The student's parents will be informed; and
- (d) The student may be issued a written warning for poor conduct stating such an offence at the end of the school year.

The above measures will seriously affect the student's chances of promotion to the next level of study.

12. Before, between and after the Form 5 Internal Examination and the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination, students are NOT to play football or any sports during school hours. Also, students are NOT to roam around the school. All areas are out of bounds except the Library and Tuckshop.
